Founded by Pope St. John Paul II in 1997, today is also the **World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life.** He attached it to "Candlemas Day" because the consecrated men and women are to be the light in the world, imitating **Jesus**, the **Light of the World**.

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, forty days after the birth of Jesus. 2nd February is also known as Candlemas Day as traditionally all the Church's candles were blessed for the year.

In pre-Christian times, 2nd February marked the mid point of winter, half way between the winter solstice (shortest day) and the spring equinox. Some people lit candles to scare away evil spirits on the dark winter nights.

New - Lent Talks and Lunches: Churches Together Marnhull

Lent talks will begin on Friday, 7 March at 12 midday and continue every subsequent Friday in Lent finishing on 11 April. The talks will last for 30 minutes and will be followed by a light lunch, the proceeds of which will be donated to the food bank. The subject of this year's talks is prayer, and over the six weeks we will reflect on the importance of prayer in the life of a Christian. The leaders will invite those present to experience different forms of prayer: Lectio, Ignatian, Celtic, Prayer of Silence, Our Father. All talks are open to all denominations. Our Lady's will lead the talks on 21st March and 11th of April. Please note that we will only be able to offer lunch after three of the talks. This is because there is a clash between the village lunches and Lent lunches. Lunch will be offered on the 14th, 21st and 28th March. Our Lady's will provide lunch on 21st March. The tradition of ecumenical Lent talks is an old one in Marnhull, and it provides a significant witness to our shared faith. Please come and listen and enjoy a bowl of soup with wonderful company. Did you know that there is a prayer group in our parish that meets every month to learn more about how to spread our Catholic Faith? Our parish group meets at Our Lady's on the third Thursday of the month, with the time changing through the seasons. Our next parish meeting will be on Thursday 20th February after 9.30.am.
