"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the

poor. "Recent Sunday readings were a timely reminder to us all of the Church's mission to spread the Good News of the Gospel, in Greek 'the Evangelion'. As St Teresa expressed so famously, WE are now God's hands, feet etc to go out to the whole world in the place of Christ. How we offer witness as individuals is just that: we may not be called to go out on the missions or stand on street corners or preach but as St Peter wrote, "the body does not consist of one member but of many." We can all witness simply through how we live as Christians; we also have a responsibility to witness through what we say when those opportunities arise to share our Baptismal hope. St Peter also wrote: "Always be prepared to make a defence to anyone who calls you to account for the hope you have in you, yet do it with gentleness and love." As Ezra gave the people the meaning of the Law so that the people understood, so we all need to understand our faith as much as we can and how to express it with confidence, even just in a few words, to those we meet in our daily lives. As Pilgrims of Hope, learning about faith is ongoing! Our Parish group meets generally on the third Thursday of the month for about an hour with a short period of Adoration followed by the sharing of encounters (and sometimes missed opportunities from which we can learn), plus planning for the future through the liturgical Calendar, studying the Catechism and Scriptures (watch this space), local events, and reaching out to others: the lapsed, other Christians and those many who have little knowledge of Christ and His Church. Next meeting: Thursday 20th February after 9.30 Mass but other times could be arranged. Do come and see what help we can give each other to share our beautiful faith.
